 respective hands by virtue of the trusts aforesaid to deduct and retain to
 and reimburse themselves respectively all such reasonable Costs Charges
 Damages and Expenses as they respectively shall or may sustain expend
 or be put into in or about the execution of the trusts aforesaid and
 that they my said Trustees respectively or their respective Heirs Executors
 or Administrators shall not be charged or chargeable with or for any
 sum or sums of Money or Efforts other than such as shall actually come
 to their respective hands by virtue of this my Will nor one for the other
 of them or for the Acts Negligence Defaults or mismanagements of the
 other or others but each of them for his own act receipt payment and wilful
 default only nor with or for any loss or damage which shall or may or
 happen in or about the execution of all or any of the trusts aforesaid
 without their respective wilful default or neglect provided also and I
 do hereby declare that the Receipt or Receipts of them my said son John
 Townsend and the said Jonathan Belcher or the Survivor of them or
 his Heirs under their or his hands or hand for all or any part of the
 purchase Money as well for the said Advancements and promised share
 in Haringdon aforesaid or any part thereof as for the said Expected
 Advancements and promised share in Little Cornwell or any part thereof
 in case the same last mentioned promised shall become saleable in
 pursuance of this my Will shall be good and effectual discharges to the
 purchaser or purchasers of the said promises respectively or any part
 thereof for so much of the said purchase money as shall be therein
 expressed to be received and that after such receipt or receipts shall be
 given and signed such purchaser and purchasers his Heirs or Heirs Heirs
 Executors and Administrators shall not in afterwords be answerable or be
 accountable for any loss misapplication or nonapplication of the said
 purchase money or any part thereof In witness whereof I the said Jonathan
 Townsend have to the four first Sheets of this my last Will and Testament
 (contained in five parts of paper) set my hand and to the last Sheet set
 my hand and Seal the twenty seventh day of September in the Year of

 weak in Body and of perfect Mind and Memory thank God and raising
 into mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed
 for all Men once to die So make and ordain this my last Will and
 Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend

and my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the direction of my Executors ^{not} doubting But at the general or a resurrection of all revive the same again By the almighty power of God And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First of all I give to my dear wife my beloved wife All the Money I have in England after the sum of Money left to my Children is paid and to keep her little Boy And if she die before the family to dispose of it in the family as she think fit in Turners Family Also I give to John Turner my Beloved son the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds and part of the stock Also to Abraham Turner my Beloved son the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds and part of the stock Also to ~~Abraham Turner my beloved son~~ Elizabeth Philon my beloved daughter one hundred and fifty pounds ~~and~~ and lawful money and a part of the stock remaining Also to Robert Turner the daughter of Wm Turner Junr the sum of one hundred pounds when of age And if in case of death to fall to the family ratifying and confirming this and know this to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and ^{year} above written - William Turner, Signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said William Turner as his last will and Testament in the presence of us the subscribers - Henry Powell - Edward X Tizzard his Marks,

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appeared personally William Fryer of Wimbome in the County of Dorset Merchant and made Oath that on or about the twentieth day of December last he received a packet from James Blaskie of Saint Johns in the Island of Newfoundland containing among other papers the last will and Testament of William Turner late of Sticks in Bonavista Bay in the Island of Newfoundland aforesaid deceased now deceased and that the Deposition upon opening the said packet and perusing the said will observed the word "fifty" struck through in the twenty fourth and twenty seventh lines of the first side and also in the second line of the second side of the said will And the Deposition saith that the said will is now in all respects in the same plight and condition as when received by the Deposition as aforesaid - William Fryer - The 16th day of May 1820 the said William Fryer was duly sworn to the truth of this Affidavit by Virtue of the Commission hereto annexed Before me - James Mayo Junr - Commys -

On the 25th May 1820 Admou (with the will annexed) of the Goods Chattels & Credits of William Turner late of Sticks in Bonavista Bay in the Island of Newfoundland deceased was granted to William Fryer the constituted Attorney of Joanna Turner Widow the Relict of the said deceased being first sworn by Court duly to administer for the use and benefit of the said Joanna Turner now residing at Bonavista Bay in the Island of Newfoundland.
